1. Definition of Terms

Centrex Service

Centrex Service is a central office based service which is furnished subject to the availability of facilities, features and central office equipment in locations determined by the Company. The service does not include any customer premise equipment.

Company

Refers to Dubois Telephone Exchange, Inc.

Customer

A person, firm, corporation, non-profit organization, or governmental agency for whom service is rendered and who is responsible for paying for Company provided exchange service charges and for complying with the rules and regulations of the Company.

2. Non-Essential Services

2.1 Services

A. Centrex Service

1. Centrex Service is a central office based Touch-Tone service which is furnished subject to the availability of facilities, features and central office equipment in locations determined by the Company. The service does not include any customer premise equipment.
2. Each Centrex line may be arranged for two-way, one-way incoming or one-way outgoing operation depending upon the option chosen by the customer at the time the line is installed. When a change in the arrangement is requested by the customer, the appropriate service charges as specified under Service Connections and Nonrecurring Charges section of the Company's Exchange Tariff apply.
3. Centrex Service is not provided in association with public or semi-public telephone service.
4. Centrex Service may be provided in association with trunks; however, lines terminating on a key or PBX system will be charged at the applicable trunk rate.
5. Service charges as specified under Service Connections and Move and Change Charges of the Company's Exchange Tariff apply to all station line installations, customer requested moves, changes and rearrangements performed by the Company.
6. Terminal equipment provided by the customer must be compatible with the services and equipment provided by the Company. Such equipment must be Touch-Tone capable.
7. All applicable end user fees and surcharges will apply to each line.
8. Directory Listings will be furnished subject to the rates and regulations pursuant to Company policy.
9. Service will be provided on a month-to-month basis at the rates as specified above. These rates are in addition to the applicable local service rate specified in Section 4 of the Company's Exchange Tariff.
10. Regulations as specified in the General Rules and Regulations section of the Company's Exchange Tariff will apply to this service
11. All exchange lines in a system must be served by the same central office and have the same billing arrangement.

2. Non-Essential Services (cont'd)

2.1 Services (cont'd)

A. Centrex Services (cont'd)

12. Centrex Offerings:

Speed Call - This feature allows a user to place calls to a previously designated list of up to 6 or 30 frequently dialed numbers.

B. Custom Calling/CLASS Service

1. General

Custom Calling / CLASS Service consists of one or more of the following optional features which provide special kinds of communication features on individual service lines. Custom calling / CLASS is available only with one party business and residence service in central offices which, at the Company's option, are appropriately equipped and facilities are available. Some CLASS features require Signaling System 7 (SS7) hardware and software for interoffice operation. This interoffice functionality is only provided upon availability of facilities.

2. Descriptions

a. Features

- i. Call Forward No Answer (CFD) – Allows customer to program the base phone to be forwarded after a specified number of rings. The forward to number can be changed as often as necessary. If the forward to directory number is a toll call, the base phone will incur a toll charge.
- ii. Calling Number Delivery (CND) – Allows customer to receive the calling number on incoming calls. Calling numbers will not be displayed if the call originates from an area that does not have the appropriate network signaling connections.

Telephone numbers transmitted via CND may not be sold or given to another party without the caller's consent. Calling number information may only be used for: a) routing or completion of calls, b) billing of calls, c) account management purposes, d) services directly related to the call or transaction, e) verification of calling party identity and f) marketing products or services that are directly related to those previously acquired by the customer from the number delivery services subscriber. CND customers failing to comply with any of these conditions will have their service terminated.

Subscription to Calling Number Delivery requires the lease or purchase of a display telephone or an add-on display unit by the customer.

2. Non-Essential Services (cont'd)

2.1 Services (cont'd)

B. Custom Calling/CLASS Service (cont'd)

2. Descriptions

- iii. Calling Name Delivery (CNAM) – Allows customer to receive the calling name on incoming calls. The name is delivered to the called party's CPE in the interval between the first and second ring. Calling names will not be displayed if the call originates from an area that does not have the appropriate network signaling connections. This may exclude calls made from most cellular phones, calls made through some interexchange carriers, and calls originated from other local exchange carriers. If the caller is calling from a multi-party line, or is blocked, the name will not be displayed.

CNAM will be provided in connection with single residence and business lines where Telephone Company facilities permit.

- iv. Call Transfer (UTF) - Allows the customer to transfer a call to another number, establishing a connection between two other parties. The customer does not need to remain on the line for the other two parties to remain connected.
- v. Call Waiting (CWT) – Alerts a subscriber who is on an established call that a third party is trying to call. The called party may either ignore the waiting call or answer the call. The customer can alternate between the two parties.
- vi. Call Waiting Enhanced (CWTE) – Allows customer to prevent call waiting tones from being applied to the line on a per call basis. Incoming calls to the busy line will receive a busy tone. CCWT will be deactivated when the call is terminated.
- vii. Caller ID/Call Waiting - This service displays the identity of an incoming (calling) number even during a subscriber line busy condition so long as the identity of the calling number has not been blocked. This service requires a Caller ID/Call Waiting enable display device.
- viii. Selective Call Forwarding (SCF) – Routes important calls to an alternate phone number. The customer establishes a list of numbers where, if a calling number is on the list, calls from these numbers will be forwarded to a customer selected number. Only numbers on the list will be forwarded. If the alternate location is not a free call, the customer will be billed for each call forwarded.

This service can work with Call Forward, all calls. Numbers on the customer's preferred list will be routed to the designated Selective Call Forward number. All other calls will be routed to the regular Call Forward number.
- ix. Speed Calling 8 Numbers (SSC) – Allows customer to place calls to frequently called local or long distance numbers by dialing a one digit code.

2. Non-Essential Services (cont'd)

2.1 Services (cont'd)

B. Custom Calling/CLASS Service (cont'd)

2. Descriptions

- x. Speed Calling 30 Numbers (LSC) – Allows customer to place calls to frequently called local or long distance numbers by dialing a two digit code. The combination of Speed Call 8 and Speed Call 30 is not available.
- xi. Selective Call Forwarding - Routes important calls to an alternate phone number. The customer establishes a list of numbers where, if a calling number is on the list, calls from these numbers will be forwarded to a customer selected number. Only numbers on the list will be forwarded. If the alternate location is not a free call, the customer will be billed for each call forwarded.

This service can work with Call Forward, all calls. Numbers on the customer's preferred list will be routed to the designated Selective Call Forward number. All other calls will be routed to the regular Call Forward number.

- xii. Speed Calling 8 Numbers - Allows customer to place calls to frequently called local or long distance numbers by dialing a one digit code.
- xiii. Speed Calling 30 Numbers - Allows customer to place calls to frequently called local or long distance numbers by dialing a two digit code. The combination of Speed Call 8 and Speed Call 30 is not available.
- xiv. Three-Way Calling - Allows the customer to form a three-way conference with other telephone numbers. The originating customer must remain on the line to keep the conference established.

C. Package Options

1. General

Packaged services will be available to customers who subscribe to the Dubois Telephone local exchange services as well as DTE World for non-regulated services identified in each package.

Packages will consist of various combinations custom calling/CLASS services, and other services including toll, internet, and DSL.

Packages will only be offered in areas where all features in the applicable package are offered and available. Packages are available to business and residence customers at rates specified. All toll minutes included in the package are for calls to the lower 48 states only.

2. Non-Essential Services (cont'd)

2.1 Services (cont'd)

C. Package Options (cont'd)

- a. Freedom Plus Plan - This plan consists of caller ID, call waiting, 3-way calling, call forwarding, voice mail (basic mailbox option), and non-regulated toll services (300 minutes).
- b. Freedom Unlimited Plus Plan - This plan consists caller ID, call waiting, 3-way calling, call forwarding, voice mail (basic mailbox option), and non-regulated toll services (unlimited minutes).
- c. Freedom Plus DSL - This plan consists of caller ID, call waiting, 3-way calling, call forwarding, voice mail (basic mailbox option), and non-regulated toll services (300 minutes), plus DSL services at 256 KBps rate.
- d. Freedom Unlimited Plus DSL - This plan consists caller ID, call waiting, 3-way calling, call forwarding, voice mail (basic mailbox option), and non-regulated toll services (unlimited minutes), plus DSL services at 256 KBps
- e. Freedom Plus Dial-up - This plan consists of caller ID, call waiting, 3-way calling, call forwarding, voice mail (basic mailbox option), and non-regulated toll services (300 minutes), plus dial-up internet access.
- f. Freedom Unlimited Plus Dial-up - This plan consists of caller ID, call waiting, 3-way calling, call forwarding, voice mail (basic mailbox option), and non-regulated toll services (unlimited minutes), plus dial-up internet access.
- g. The Freedom Plus Plans are no longer available to new customers effective January 1, 2010. Subscribers to Freedom Plus plan prior to the effective date shall be charged the applicable promotional prices until the termination of the relevant agreement.

3. Simple Solutions

a. General Description & Conditions

Simple Solutions (in this section, “the Plan”) refers to a bundled service offering by the Company. For residential customers of basic local exchange service, such customers can obtain, for a flat rate of \$5 per month, five calling features - Caller ID, Call Waiting, 3-Way Calling, Call Forwarding, and Voice Mail. If the residential customer simultaneously subscribes to the local service portion of the Plan, then the subscriber can obtain unlimited long distance service for an additional flat rate of \$34 per month. If the customer simultaneously subscribes to basic local service, the subscriber can obtain any available Residential DSL service for the regular monthly rate, less a percentage discount, based on length of term agreed to. Available discounts to the regular DSL rate are 10% for a 1 year term.

2. Non-Essential Services (cont'd)

2.1 Services (cont'd)

C. Package Options (cont'd)

3. Simple Solutions (cont'd)

a. General Description & Conditions (cont'd)

If the Customer simultaneously subscribes to the local service AND the broadband service portions of the Plan, the Customer can obtain a tablet bundle for an additional flat rate of \$25 per month. The Customer is not required to simultaneously subscribe to the long distance portion of the Plan to obtain the DSL portion of the Plan and vice versa. The residential subscriber is not required to simultaneously subscribe to the long distance portion of the Plan to obtain the DSL portion of the Plan and vice versa. A residential subscriber can subscribe to all three portions of the Plan and obtain the package rates listed above.

b. Conditions

The following conditions apply to Simple Solutions:

- The Plan is available to residential customers only.
- Services are not available in all areas.
- Prices exclude taxes, surcharges and other fees.
- The Plan is Subject to the terms and conditions for the individual service components of the Plan as set forth in this price schedule, Dubois' Local Exchange Tariff, and applicable DSL service documents.
- Internet connection speeds may vary due to Web sites accessed, customer location, internet congestion or customer equipment.
- Altering, suspending or disconnecting service may cancel price guarantee and may result in an early termination fee.

c. Early Termination Fee

The Simple Solutions Plan is subject to a one-year service agreement. If the Customer cancels the Plan prior to the expiration of the one-year service agreement, the Customer will be assessed an early termination fee equal to 1/12 of the \$100 early termination fee for each full month remaining in the unsatisfied agreement period. New DSL subscribers will be subject to applicable early termination fees as defined in NECA Tariff 5. Total early termination charges not to exceed \$185. However, if the Customer cancels the Plan and has the tablet bundle portion of the Plan, the Customer will be assessed an early termination fee equal to 1/12 of the \$485 early termination fee for each full month remaining in the unsatisfied agreement period (includes \$300 early termination fee to cover the cost for the tablet).

C. Package Options (cont'd)

4. Simple Solutions for Business

a. General Description and Conditions

Simple Solutions for Business refers to a bundled service offering by Dubois Telephone Exchange. When a business customer subscribes to basic local business service, that business subscriber can obtain any combination of the following basic features for a flat rate, which will be defined by length of term - Caller ID, Call Waiting, Call Waiting Identification, 3-Way Calling, Call Forwarding, Call Forward Selective, Call Forward Busy, Call Forward No Answer, Call Forward Remote Access, Trunk Hunt, Voice Mail, Anonymous Call Rejection, Automatic Recall, Automatic Callback, Distinctive Ring and Speed Calling Short List. Monthly flat rates for any combination of these features are defined as follows: \$10 on a 1 year term, \$8 on a 2 year term and \$5 on a 3 year term. If the business subscriber simultaneously subscribes to basic local service, then the subscriber can obtain any available DSL service for the regular monthly rate, less a percentage discount, based on length of term agreed to. Available discounts to the regular DSL rate are 5% for a 1 year term, 10% for a 2 year term and 15% for a 3 year term. The business subscriber is not required to simultaneously subscribe to the calling feature portion of the Plan to obtain the DSL discount in the Plan and vice versa. Though the business customer is not required to subscribe to both calling features and DSL, if both are chosen, the agreed upon term must be the same for both features and DSL discount.

b. Conditions

The following conditions apply to Simple Solutions for Business:

- The Plan is available to business customers only.
- Services are not available in all areas.
- Prices exclude taxes, surcharges and other fees
- The Plan is subject to the terms and conditions for the individual service components of the Plan as set forth in the price schedule, DTE's Local Exchange Tariff, and applicable DSL service documents.
- Internet connection speeds may vary due to Websites accessed, customer location, internet congestion or customer equipment.
- Altering, suspending or disconnecting service may cancel price guarantee and may result in an early termination fee.

c. Early Termination Fee

The Simple Solutions for Business Plan is subject to a one, two or three year service agreement. If the Customer cancels the Plan prior to the expiration of the service agreement, the Customer will be assessed an early termination fee equal to 1/12, 1/24, or 1/36 (depending on term) of the \$185 early termination fee for each full month remaining in the unsatisfied agreement period.

3. Special Construction Within Subdivisions

3.1 Installations of Telecommunications Lines Within Subdivision, Telecommunications Lines Constructed, Installed and Owned by Utilities in Subdivisions Shall be Installed Underground

A. The following definitions are used in this section of the tariff:

APPLICANT: The developer, builder, or other person, partnership, association, firm private or public corporation, trust, estate, political subdivision, governmental agency, or other legal entity recognized by law, applying for the construction of a telecommunications distribution system in a subdivision.

BUILDING: A single structure roofed and enclosed within exterior walls, built of permanent use, erected, frame or component structural part and unified in its entirety both physically and in operation for single-family residential occupancy in a subdivision (Definition excludes mobile home).

SUBDIVISION: A lot, tract, or parcel of land divided into two or more lots, plots, sites or other divisions for use for new residential buildings or the land on which is constructed new multiple-occupancy buildings per a recorded plot thereof if such recordation is required by law.

B. The Company upon receipt of the applicant's proper application will install an underground telecommunications system with suitable materials to assure that the applicant will receive reasonably safe and adequate telecommunications service. The provision of the underground telecommunications system will be provided at no charge except where a charge is permitted under Paragraphs (D) and (F) of this section of the Tariff. Temporary service is provided under Paragraph (E) of this section of the Tariff.

C. Rights-of-Way and Easements

1. Within the applicant's subdivision, the Company will construct, own, operate, and maintain underground telephone lines only along public streets, roads, and highways which the Company has the legal right to occupy, and on public lands and private property across which rights-of-way and easements satisfactory to the Company may be obtained without cost or need for condemnation by the Company.
2. Rights-of-way and easements, within the subdivisions, satisfactory to the Company, must be furnished by the applicant in reasonable time to meet construction and service requirements before the Company shall be required to commence its installation. Such rights-of-way and easements must be cleared of trees, tree stumps and other obstructions and graded to within six inches of final grade, by applicant, at no charge to the Company. Such clearance and grading must be maintained by the applicant during construction by the Company.

3. Special Construction Within Subdivisions (cont'd)

3.1 Installations of Telecommunications Lines Within Subdivision, Telecommunications Lines Constructed, Installed and Owned by Utilities in Subdivisions Shall be Installed Underground (cont'd)

D. Advance Payments for Developments

1. Where, due to the manner in which a subdivision is developed, the Company is required to construct an underground telecommunications distribution system through a section or sections of the subdivision where service will not be connected for at least two years, then the Company may require an advance payment equal to the estimated cost of construction from the applicant before construction is commenced. If in the judgment of the Company an advance is required under the above described conditions, the Company has the right to refuse installation of the underground system until the required advance is paid to the Company.
2. If an advance is required under these rules, then the advance, without interest, shall be returned to the applicant on a pro-rata basis as the permanent service connection is made to each building or multiple-occupancy buildings.
3. Any portion of an advance remaining unrefunded ten years from the date the Company is first ready to render service with the extension will be retained by the Company and credited to the appropriate construction account.

E. Temporary Facilities

1. Temporary facilities may be installed to provide service when necessary, for a maximum period of one year.
2. Where it is necessary to place temporary facilities in advance of the permanent underground telecommunications system in order to provide telecommunications service, the Company may require the applicant to pay the estimated non-recoverable costs of the temporary facilities. If the required costs under the above described conditions apply, the Company has the right to refuse installation of the temporary facilities until the required costs are paid to the Company.

F. Special Conditions

1. In circumstances, where the application of these rules appears impractical or unjust to applicant or the Company, or discriminatory to their customers (e.g., difficult rock conditions), the Company or applicant shall refer the matter to the Wyoming Public Service Commission for special ruling or for the approval of special conditions which may be mutually agreed upon prior to commencing construction.

3. Special Construction Within Subdivisions (cont'd)

3.2 Extension of Facilities for Subdivisions/Developments

A. Developer Participation

Where the Company undertakes the construction of facilities to serve a new land development, the Company and the developer will enter into a written agreement. The developer will enter into a security deposit agreement to insure placement of telephone facilities within the development.

B. Developer Security Deposit

1. A refundable security deposit is paid by a developer and is equal to the total estimated project specific labor and material costs of the project.
2. The refundable security deposit applies when the Company undertakes the extension of facilities for exchange service associated with subdivisions and developments inside and outside the base rate area.
3. The security deposit is payable in full by the developer prior to the start of any required construction by the Company.
4. The Company will not incur expenses prior to receiving the security deposit from the developer equal to the amount of the estimated project specific labor and material costs.
5. The Company and the developer will enter into a written land development agreement and a written trench and backfill agreement for provision of the requested exchange facilities inside or outside the base rate area.
6. The land development agreement will include the following:
 - a. A copy of an approved plat,
 - b. The number of net access line gain to be developed,
 - c. An exhibit or map of the exchange facilities to be provided within the development,
 - d. The amount of the security deposit,
 - e. A term of no longer than eighty-four (84) months,
 - f. The provision for a refund which is determined as follows:
 - i. The security deposit is prorated to the number of access lines agreed upon for the subdivision/development to be served by the extension of exchange facilities,

3. Special Construction Within Subdivisions (cont'd)

3.2 Extension of Facilities for Subdivisions/Developments (cont'd)

B. Developer Security Deposit (cont'd)

- f. The provision for a refund which is determined as follows: (cont'd)
 - ii. The net increase of in service lines will be determined on an annual basis from the date the construction of the facilities is complete and service can be provided (the ready-for-service date),
 - iii. The refund will not exceed the prorated amount of the new increase in paid access lines. Later refunds are given only for those access lines in service beyond the number in service at the end of the last period in which a refund was given,
 - iv. Refunds are not made for more access lines than the total number estimated in determining the prorated cost in the agreement,
 - v. Any security deposit balance which remains at the end of the contract period because access lines have not been developed, reverts to the Company.
- 7. The trench and backfill agreement will include the following:
 - a. An approved plat,
 - b. Trench and backfill plans and specifications,
 - c. Trench excavation and backfill schedules,
 - d. Rights, responsibilities and liabilities associated with performance of the trench and backfill work.
- 8. In areas where the Company has existing trench and backfill agreements with local power utilities, the developer or owner of the subdivision or development shall be responsible for the Company's portion of the trench and backfill costs.
- 9. The developer or owner shall have the option of either (a) providing trench and backfill or (b) paying the Company's portion of joint trench and backfill costs.

3. Special Construction Within Subdivisions (cont'd)

3.2 Extension of Facilities for Subdivisions/Developments (cont'd)

C. Developer Facility Extension Charges

1. A facility extension charge is a non-refundable, nonrecurring charge assessed to the developer, when the estimated project specific labor and material costs of extending facilities exceed \$3,700, per premises. The cost of extending exchange facilities to a developer will be based on the nearest existing facilities.
2. The facility extension charges shall equal the estimated project specific labor and material costs that exceed \$3,700, per premises.

3.3 Developer Non-Participation

If a developer refuses to pay a developer security deposit or developer facility extension charge, the Company will accept requests for service from individual customers in the subdivision/development area and the charges in 6.5 will apply.
